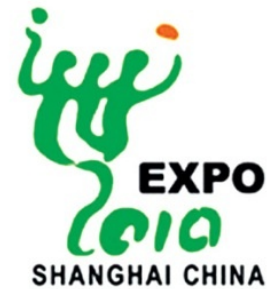

CIRCUIT 1. ARCHITECTURAL TRAIL (optional)

Full day Shanghai architectural trail, half day with an architectural expert.

First we explore Puxi and People's Square where many major places of interest are located: Shanghai Museum, which contains one of the world's finest collections of Chinese art, the Glass Opera House by Jean-Marie Charpentier, and the Shanghai Museum of Art. MOCA (Museum of Contemporary Art) offers temporary exhibitions, acting as both a domestic and international platform in Shanghai. Nearby is the Shanghai Urban Planning Exhibition hall, which houses a history of Shanghai's past, present, and future, from an urban planning perspective.

It gives a beautiful scale model of Shanghai, with models of future skyscrapers that will be built.

We finish the tour on the Bund, where the great foreign commercial houses and banks built their imposing office buildings in the first half of the twentieth century. Our walk takes us along the edge of the Huangpu River,



affording a sweeping view of the architectural splendour of the entire Bund, and our guide points out to us some of the buildings that are most interesting from the point of view of architecture and history.

Then simultaneously experience the old and new of Shanghai through a cruise along the Huangpu River, located between the commercial skyscrapers of modern Shanghai and the century old edifices of the colonial Shanghai.

FACTORY VISIT TO BAOSTEEL (included)

- Baosteel Group Corporation is the most competitive steelmaker in China. In 2008 Baosteel ranked 259th in the list of Global 500 published by American Fortune magazine; Standard & Poor granted the long-term credit rating "A-" to Baosteel with outlook "stable"; Baosteel is also enrolled in Fortune's list of "World's most admired companies" from out of 1500 internationally renowned candidates. The main steel business of Baosteel focuses on the production of hi-tech and high value-added premium steel, with an annual production capacity around 30 million tons. Baosteel's products sell well at home and abroad. Its steel industry covers three major categories: carbon steel, stainless steel and specially-alloyed steel, which are widely applied in the sectors of automobile, home appliance, petrochemical, machinery manufacture, energy and transportation, building and decoration, metal products, aerospace, nuclear power and electronic instruments, etc. While maintaining its dominance in domestic flat product market, Baosteel's products are also exported to over 40 countries and regions including Japan, South Korea, Europe and America.

CIRCUIT 2. Afternoon program for travel companions: old town of Shanghai (optional)

- Visit of Confucius temple and school. Offering quiet refuge from the crowded streets of the old Chinese city, the temple features a lingxin men (gate) leading to the main hall, Dacheng Dian. To the northeast, the Zunjing Ge, formerly the library, now houses a display of unusually shaped rocks. Back near the entrance, Kuixing Ge is a three-storey 20m-high pagoda dedicated to the god of liberal arts.

- Visit of Yu Garden, the most celebrated Chinese garden in Shanghai, where each stone, pavilion and stream replicates the Southern Chinese garden style made popular during the Qing and Ming dynasties

- Visit of Wan Jin Arts private museum.

Gu Embroidery is a famous embroidery style named after its originator, the Gu family of the Ming Dynasty in Songjiang. The striking feature of Gu Embroidery is the lifelike reproduction of masterful paintings of various dynasties on canvas using embroidery threads. Therefore Gu Embroidery is also known as "Embroidery Painting".

Established in 2004, Wan Jin Arts Museum was founded by three young couples with the goal to help to know and like more about Gu embroidery and give their support in an effort to revitalize this magnificent form of arts and crafts, which is now listed in "National Culture and Heritage Protection Application list".

Early departure to the Yangshan deep-water port, a new harbour in Hangzhou Bay - south of Shanghai. Built to circumvent growth limitations for the Port of Shanghai as a result of shallow waters, it allows berths with depths of up to 15 metres to be built, and is capable of handling the largest container ships today. The port achieves this by building on the offshore islands of Greater and Lesser Yangshan (part of the Zhoushan archipelago), which have been amalgamated by land reclamation and connected to the mainland via the Donghai Bridge, the latter of which was opened on 1 December 2005 as the third-longest bridge in the world at 32.5 km in length. For this visit, you will receive special pass permits, and VIP platform access.

CIRCUIT 4. AFTERNOON HISTORIC WALKING TOUR IN THE OLD FRENCH CONCESSION (optional)

Afternoon walk in the old French concession with an official guide of the "Shanghai Historic House Association" which arranges tours and lectures concerning Shanghai's unique architectural heritage. The tree-lined streets and colonial era houses of the French Concession rekindle memories of 1930's Shanghai, or the "Paris of the East." Most of the houses of this area remain intact, providing a charming area for strolling, imagining the life of Shanghai's wealthy community prior to World War II, browsing in a few shops, and sampling a few of China's most famous teas in a tea shop. To see what the interiors of these houses looked like, we spend a few minutes to go through either the home of Sun Yatsen or of Song Qingling. Stop in "Taikang Lu Art Street" to meet designers and artists.



Afternoon tea in the Ruijin Park, part of former estate of the Morris family, owners of the North China Daily News, the oldest English-language newspaper in China. This grand estate occupying a whole city block is now also home to a number of top restaurants and bars. The well-manicured lawns are delightful to stroll.

Private visit of a villa in Xing Guo Lu, managed by an elite group of specialists known and respected for their knowledge and passion of Asian art and antiquities. This group hand-selects all the fine pieces which can be discovered in the villa: antiquities, Chinese furniture and contemporary paintings are shown as in a private house, but everything is to sell !

Then stop in an authentic spa to try Chinese reflexology and massage.

FAREWELL DINNER (included)

In the evening, transfer to Yongfoo Elite restaurant for the farewell dinner. Upon entering the garden you are transported to another era, greeted by a stunning Buddhist Statue, an ancient magnolia tree, and a villa from the 1930's. The product of over two and a half years of work, after being the former British consulate, the interior combines European vintage and Chinese antiques: a green Gucci leather sofa sits beside a Ming Dynasty bed where a nobleman's daughter once slept.

The restaurant is one of the first in town to have a member-only policy.

Yangshan Deep Water Port – Detailed
description

Shanghai requires a world-class container port to transport the manufactured products of the Yangtze River Delta to the world.

- The Yangtze River Delta is a key export hub of China. Around 37% of China's export are manufactured in the Yangtze River Delta area, a 4-hour driving radius within Shanghai
- More than 90% of exports are transported by container freight to its markets

- Shanghai, being at the mouth of the Yangtze River, has traditionally serves as an important import and export gateway for the region

Prior to the Yangshan Deep Water Port, Shanghai, being the financial and logistics centre of the Yangtze River Delta, did not have a world-class port. Exports had to go through alternative ports, with some requiring a 20-hour drive from the manufacturing centre

- Most large shipping vehicles require depth of 15 meters while in port. Shanghai existing ports had great limitations.
 - Huangpu River: Depth of Huangpu River around 7 to 8 meters
 - Waigaoqiao deepwater project had a depth of 13 meters. However, difficult to maintain due to the silting of the river. Boats could only enter during high-tide
- Shanghai alternative ports
 - Ningbo. Deep water sea port of > 15 meters, and close to Shanghai (4 hours drive). However, infrastructure insufficient to support such large quantities of containers
 - Pearl River Delta. The ports of Hong Kong and Shenzhen could handle the traffic, but required a drive of 15 to 20 hours from Yangtze River Delta
 - Dalian: Dalian could also take some of the traffic, but required a 10 + hour drive from Yangtze River Delta

¶ Given the geographical constraints of Shanghai, the government embarked on the construction of the ambitious Yangshan Deep water port to cement Shanghai's as the key gateway port to the world.

- An innovative approach to place the port in the middle of the sea
 - No suitable port (with depth of >15 meters) on the coast of the mainland, or upstream from the sea on a major river.
 - The islands of Small Yangshan, and Big Yangshan, 27.5km from Shanghai's Southern coast, were chosen as the site of the deep water port. The islands act as a natural typhoon shelter, and have been amalgamated by land reclamation.
 - The islands were not populated in the past
- To link up the port with the mainland, the Donghai Bridge was built
 - Third longest bridge in the world, 32.5km in length, 3 lanes with 40 meter clearance (after Japan, and the newly built Hangzhou bridge)
 - Annual capacity of 5 million TEU
- When fully completed in 2020, there will be 50 container berths (22km quayside), handling 25 million TEUs, and making it the biggest and busiest container terminal in the world.
 - The first two phases are currently operational, with nine berths in total along a 3 km quayside.

- The third phase, to be opened in stages, will be completed by 2010 with 30 berths, capable of handling 15 million TEUs annually
- The total cost of Yangshan port may reach US\$ 12 billion over 20 years
 - Infrastructure funded by local government and banks
 - Phase III and IV container terminals partially funded by terminal operators (Hutchison Ports, PSA)
- ¶ The port is destined to be the largest and most important port, though many challenges exist.
 - Good supporting infrastructure, with the Pudong airport, highways, and railway network linked with the ports, allowing for multi-modal logistics
 - Yangshan port will strive to become a trans-shipment port and not only a terminal port. Smaller feeder vessels from the ports in eastern China will carry boxes forth and back, and larger vessels will sail oceanic routes.
 - However, many challenges exist.
 - Typhoons and other storms may limit Yangshan's operations to 270 days a year.
 - Erosion of concrete may limit the lifespan of the bridge. Current expected lifespan is 100 years
 - Reports that the reclamation area of the island is sinking.

“Better City, Better Life,”

World Expo 2010 Shanghai China is the occasion for China to bring the world at home, and for the world to feel at home in China. By dedicating a 5.28-square-kilometer area at the core of the city to exhibitions, events and forums on the Expo theme, "Better City, Better Life," Shanghai hopes to build a powerful and lasting pilot example of sustainable and harmonious urban living.

Taking into account such factors as proper walking distance and perception of visitors, the master plan of Expo Shanghai puts forward a five-level structure of park, enclosed area, zones, groups and clusters.

Park: The Expo Site covers a total area of 5.28 sq km, including the enclosed area and outside areas of support facilities. The Expo Site spans both sides of the Huangpu River, with 3.93 sq km in Pudong and 1.35 sq km in Puxi.

Enclosed Area: Enclosed area measures 3.28 sq km (2.39 sq km in Pudong and 0.9 sq km in Puxi).

Zones: There are five functional zones marked A, B, C, D and E respectively, each with an average area of 60 hectares.

Groups: There are 12 pavilion groups, 8 of which in the Pudong Section and 4 in the Puxi Section, each with an average area of 10–15 hectares.

Clusters: There are 26 pavilion clusters, each covering 2–3 hectares. The average floor area of each pavilion cluster can accommodate 40–45 exhibition units with each exhibition unit covering a total floor area of 20,000–25,000 square meters. For the sake of convenience, each pavilion cluster will contain small canteens, shops, telecom, toilets, nursing services and other public facilities.

Foreign national pavilions, to be grouped by the continent they belong to, will include 3 types: Type 1, pavilions designed and built by official participants; Type 2, stand-alone pavilions built by the Organizer and rented to participants; Type 3, joint pavilions constructed by the Organizer and offered spaces to developing nations free of charge.

Zone A is located between the Expo Boulevard to the west and the Bailianjing rivulet to the east in the Pudong Section. Zone A will host China Pavilion and national pavilions for Asian countries except Southeast Asian ones.

Zone B covers an area between Zone A to the east and Lupu Bridge to the west, hosting national pavilions of Southeast Asian and Oceanian countries, Pavilions for International Organizations, Theme Pavilions, Expo Centre and Performance Centre.

Zone C is located in Houtan to the west of Lupu Bridge in the Pudong Section. It will host European, American and African national pavilion clusters. A large public amusement park of about 10 hectares will be built at the entrance.

Zone D is located to the west of the Expo Boulevard in the Puxi Section. The land is one of the original places of modern Chinese national industry and the site of the Jiangnan Shipyard. Some of the old industrial buildings will be kept and renovated into corporate pavilions. The docklands and slipway to the east of the corporate pavilions will be reserved and made into space for outdoor public exhibition and cultural exchange.



Zone E located to the east of the Expo Boulevard in the Puxi Section, will host stand-alone corporate pavilions, Urban Civilization Pavilion, Urban Exploration Pavilion and the Urban Best Practices Area.

Permanent Buildings:

China Pavilion

The China Pavilion is designed with the concept of "Oriental Crown". The traditional Chinese wooden structure architecture element -- Dougong brackets is introduced. The design concept, "the Oriental Crown, the Crest of Chinese, the Barn for the World and Wealthy People," reflects the deep accumulation of Chinese culture. The main colour of the China Pavilion is the traditional and sacred colour, "Gugong (Forbidden City) Red" which represents the taste and spirit of Chinese culture. The China Pavilion consists of the 47,000-square-meter Chinese national pavilion, 38,000-square-meter Regional joint pavilion and 3,300-square-meter pavilion of Hong Kong, Macao and Taiwan.

Theme Pavilions

The Theme Pavilions are located in Zone B of the enclosed area of the Expo Site and to the west of Expo Boulevard. The shape of the Theme Pavilions borrows from the "lane" and "dormer" of the old Shanghai, to form a two to three-dimensional spatial structure by means of "origami". The Theme Pavilions will be built into a "green, energy-saving, environment-friendly" building with an aboveground area of 80,000 square meters and underground of 40,000 square meters.

Expo Boulevard

The Expo Boulevard is located in the centre of the Pudong part of the Expo Site and is the largest stand-alone structure within the Expo Site. The Expo Boulevard has two floors underground, one above the ground and one canopy. The Expo Boulevard is a semi-open structure and will serve as a large transportation and commercial centre with multiple purposes. The Expo Boulevard will act as the main axis for human traffic flow and sightseeing in the Expo Site during Expo Shanghai and will continue to be main axis of landscapes in the city after Expo Shanghai.

World Expo Centre

The Expo Centre is located at the water-front greenland in Zone B of the Expo Site. This building stretches 350 meters from the west to the east, and 140 meters from the north to the south, with a total floor area of 140,000 square meters. The Expo Centre will be completed and put into trial operation by the end of 2009. Being one of the major permanent buildings, the Centre will serve as the centre for ceremonies and conferences, press conferences and various forums during Expo Shanghai.

Expo Performance Centre

Located in the north of the Pudong Section of the Expo Site and to the east of the Expo Boulevard, the Expo Performance Centre has a floor area of 126,000 square meters, of which 74,000 square meters is above ground and 52,000 square meters underground area. It will be completed and put into trial operation by the end of 2009.

The centre mainly consists of large central stage, large functional hall which can house 18,000 audiences and supporting facilities. The audience seats are convertible between 4,000 seats, 8,000 seats, 12000 seats and 18,000 seats based on requirements for performance and volume of audiences. The central stage is the first of its kind in China which can be adjusted to form different shapes within 360 degrees. Therefore, it can provide huge space for stage design, artistic innovation and imagination for various performances.

This program, conceived early October, seems to be the best possible to our knowledge. In due time, it could well be improved if we find out about new and exciting activities linked to the World Expo.
